iNEER Awards

The iNEER Board presents a number of awards each year to recognise highly qualified individuals and educational partnerships for their contributions to advancing international understanding and cooperation in engineering education and research. The awards are based on nominations by members of iNEER and are reviewed by an international committee appointed by the Board. Awards, in the form of engraved plaques, will be presented at the Awards Ceremony on 1 August 2012 at the Turku Castle.

AWARD CATEGORIES

iNEER has a number of awards which they present to recipients during the ICEE conference. Three of these are highlighted as follows.

Leadership Award - This is the highest level of an award given by iNEER. This award is presented to an individual or educational partnership for visionary leadership, for significant innovations

and for producing broad, long-lasting, positive impacts on international engineering education and research. The ideas and/or work for which such a leader is recognised with this award will be of an over-arching nature with global impact.

Achievement Award - The second highest honour given by iNEER, this award is given to an individual or educational partnership for innovations and exemplary, sustained, superior accomplishments in promoting international cooperation in engineering education that benefit a number of institutions in several regions of the world.

Recognition Award - This award recognises an individual or educational partnership for innovations and sustained, dedicated and exemplary contributions to international cooperation that have led to close interaction between institutions in two or more nations.

General Information of Turku

THE CITY OF TURKU

Turku, the capital of Western Finland, is a fascinating combination of both old and new.

Turku has everything for the modern urbanite, but also for tourists interested in the treasures of history. Turku offers skilled and educated workforce, modern municipal engineering, good international connections and flexible service for companies and businesses.

Turku is a nationally remarkable harbour, trade and fair city; a popular location for congresses and other marjor events. As the most famous cultural city in Finland, Turku offers many different types of events all year round. For example, the oldest rock festival in Europe, Ruisrock, the Mediaval Market, Music Festival Aurajoki Virtaa and the Turku Music Festival are part of the summer in Turku.

In the wintertime, the official Christmas City of Finland is filled with numerous performances, events and Christmas markets. The Christmas in Turku culminates in the proclamation of Christmas peace on Christmas Eve from the balcony of the Brinkkala building, which is televised internationally.

Turku has a longer educational history than any other Finnish city - the first school in the city, the Cathedral School, was founded along with the Cathedral of Turku in the late 13th century.

The first university in Finland, the "Royal Academy of Turku" (now University of Helsinki) was established in the city in 1640. Today Turku is home to about 35 000 higher education students.

Turku University of Applied Sciences (TUAS) is one of the most attractive universities of applied sciences in the country. TUAS is a multi-branch educational community of some 9 000 students and 750 staff members.

The University of Turku is one of the largest academic university in Finland (20 000 students), as measured by student enrolment, and one of the oldest as well, having been founded in 1920.

Åbo Akademi, founded 1918 as the second academic university of Finland, is Finland's only Swedish-language university.

The city also offers studies at Diaconia University of Applied Sciences, HUMAK University of Applied Sciences, and Novia University of Applied Sciences.

Information to Authors

ORAL PRESENTATION

- Be present at least five minutes before your presentation session begins.
- The chair for each session will introduce the session and control the question and answer section. The session chair informs you when you are running out of time and will stop the presentation at the end of your allocated period, please be prepared for this.
- Introduce yourself to the chair and give her/him your name, institution and country on a paper sheet.
- Check that your presentation is available and uploaded on the computer. A technician will be available to assist you during your presentation.
- Remember that you have actually less than 15 minutes to present your paper and then at least 5 minutes for questions and discussion.
- If a presenter is missing she/he will not be waited for. The next presenter will take the place of the missing presenter and the session will end before the allocated time.

 If you need to preview your presentation, please, contact registration desk.

POSTER PRESENTATION

- The conference poster session will be held on Wednesday, 1 August, from 14.00 to 15.00.
- The place of poster session will be at the entrance hall of the ICT Building.
- During the poster session, at least one of the authors must remain at the display to introduce the contents of the display, answer questions and discuss the topics of the poster.
- The conference organizers will bring the poster screens and pins to the entrance hall in the morning on Wednesday, 1 August. They also mark the screens by paper numbers.
- Find your screen during the Wednesday morning and mount your poster on the screen using the pins.
 Please, do the mounting during the lunch break at the latest.

Local Connections

Turku has frequent and reliable local bus connections. All the bus routes pass via the Market Place. At Eerikinkatu street you can find bus stops for the routes 6, 32, 42, 110 and 320 which drive near the ICT Building. The payment system in the buses in Turku is mainly based on different bus cards; however the easiest, but not the cheapest, way is to buy a single ticket in cash (EUR 2.50/person).


24h travel ticket to local buses

The ticket costs EUR 5.50 and is sold in the buses (cash only). The ticket is valid for 24 hours from the moment of purchase.

Tourist Card to local buses


You can save ticket money if you make three journeys by bus during one day.

- The card is valid for 1-7 days.
- The card can't be bought in the buses.

- The tourist card must be read by the card reader on the bus. The card is valid once it is registered by the card reader, and it is also valid on the night buses.
- The card includes a guided city tour organised by Turku Touring.
- The card can be bought at the Local Traffic Service Office (Aurakatu 5) and at the department stores Stockmann (Yliopistonkatu 22) and Wiklund (Eerikinkatu 11), and Turku Touring tourist information (Aurakatu 4).
- The Tourist Card costs EUR 5.50 / one day, EUR 8.20 / two days, EUR 10.90 / three days, EUR 13.60 / four days, EUR 16.30 / five days, EUR 19.00 / six days and EUR 21.70 / seven days.



TurkuCard

The TurkuCard carries many advantages for tourists – you'll get to see the numerous sights of Turku, and a host of other benefits as well.

TurkuCard also allows you to travel free-of-charge on the Turku Public Transportion buses.
TurkuCard holders have free access to almost all museums in the city and the Turku Sightseeing Tour.

The card can be bought at Turku Touring tourist information (Aurakatu 4), at hotels and at museums.

24h TurkuCard costs EUR 21.00 and 48 h TurkuCard costs EUR 28.00.

Train Connections

Right opposite the ICT Building is Kupittaa Railway station with connections to Helsinki. The Turku main railway station is located at Ratapihankatu 37

with connections to Tampere, Helsinki and the rest of Finland.

Taxis

Taxis are generally easily available and very reliable, but quite expensive (from ICEE hotels to ICT Building approx. EUR 10.00). Taxis are available at designated taxi ranks but calling the central dispatch is the common method to get a taxi.
